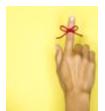

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Principal's Message

Dear Briones Parents

Congratulations, you survived the Halloween Parade, the Harvest Festival, and Halloween over three consecutive days! The students, of course, enjoyed every bit of it. Many thanks to all the parent and teacher volunteers who made these events so successful.

Now, important items for November:

- Like any good parent, I check all the candy that my kids collect on Halloween. Admittedly, I love the sweets, but I do make it a point to eat a wide variety of fresh fruits and vegetables. With the holidays approaching and with them the usual full-court press of candy and cookies, I invite you to ensure that your child is eating right and staying active on a daily basis. Do your best to skip the cupcakes and candy for the informal birthday celebrations that some classrooms hold after lunch recess and after school. Send your child with fruits and vegetables for lunch and leave the processed sugary, salty foods at home - and should you need some help, feel free to drop off any remaining Halloween candy for my personal inspection! Our PTA has a Wellness Committee that works to improve the healthy options for students and has posted on the web site a letter that lists many such food choices. As a result of parent Suzanne Sullivan's collaborative work with school and district personnel, Juana Briones has been chosen to pilot a new lunch program, the *Kid's Way Café*, which has already begun offering organic yogurt, carrot sticks, and edamame.
- As for exercise, our school has a robust physical education program. Encourage your child to take full advantage of it by remembering to



wear tennis shoes. We also have a running/walking lunchtime club, which should make its first appearance soon. It is good practice for our signature event in March, *The 2011 Juana Run*. Make sure your child participates in the sprint, the mile, or even the big one, the 8K. This year, make it a goal to expose your child to a healthy lifestyle by training now for the 2011 Juana run. Every student should participate and now is the time to become accustomed to walking/ running a mile or more.

- The regular attendance issues have come to the forefront again, perhaps because students and staff are sniffing from colds and allergies as the seasons change. We have had a significant increase in the number of late arrivals. Our new computer student information system requires us to log attendance immediately when the bell rings at 8:15AM, so please invest those few minutes in the morning to ensure a prompt arrival. If your child is late, (s)he must go to the office for a tardy slip. Curiously, the office staff has noticed an inordinate rise in the number of parents taking their children out early. If your child needs to leave class early—for an unavoidable doctor's appointment, for example—then you must obtain an official 'Permit To Leave School' from the office. Hand this to the teacher, so that your child can be released from class. I will be following up attendance issues by sending out reminder letters in November. When children arrive late or leave early, it disrupts the entire classroom. Please see me if you have any questions.

We hope you all had a chance to see Pumpkin Fiesta, starred and crewed by some of our very talented 3rd, 4th and 5th graders. The production was part of the Outreach Program of The Palo Alto Children's Theatre (this program comes to school every three years). 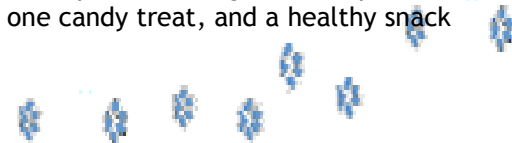
